As we watch the films together, we may even glimpse God at work in one way or another, whether we call him by that name or not. Above all, we hope that those attending will enjoy the films and through them come to a greater understanding of the world we live in, the people we share it with, and the things we long and hope for in our community life together. It took some time to restart Features as we needed to understand the licensing requirements for showing films to the public. We also needed to replace some equipment. We were very grateful to the Circuit for the grant to purchase a new projector.

Our films and refreshments are free, but we have a donations box for the charity of the month.
